"Light, Lasers and Healing" a New Approach for the New Millennium.

Course Description

A LANAP, or Laser Assisted New Attachment Procedure, is a Laser Surgical procedure, performed with a specific ND:YAG wavelength laser, that allows for targeted removal of diseased gum tissue, in a minimally invasive manner that creates faster and in most cases, more comfortable healing than traditional gum surgery.

At first, the laser removes diseased tissue and begins to loosen the calculus, or tartar from the root surface of the tooth. The laser light targets the tissue that is infected with bacteria but leaves the healthy or "un-infected" tissue alone.

Speaker Biographies

Dr. Neal Lehrman is a periodontist practicing in both NYC and Southampton, NY. His area of expertise is laser based regenerative surgery as well as implantology with an eye towards treating ailing and failing dental implants. As an instructor at the IALD and a clinical assistant professor at Rutgers SOM, DR. Lehrman heads up a research dedicated to investigating and reporting how laser-based motilities can help in the perio/endo sector.

Dr. Neal Lehrman is an expert in the field of Laser Periodontal Therapy, and is the first Periodontist in NYC to be certified to perform LANAP - Laser Assisted New Attachment Procedure. Dr. Lehrman has been in specialty practice since 1996.

His clinical responsibilities go hand in hand with his research and publishing across the spectrum of periodontics and laser surgery. His philosophy is that in order to be the best clinician, one must continue to be thinking of how to move the care of patients forward in a more comfortable and effective manner.

After completing dental school at the State University at Stony Brook, Dr. Lehrman completed his training in periodontics and implantology at UMDNJ-NJDS. In the final year of his training, he also served as Chief Resident of the department.

Dr. Lehrman has spent significant time working with indigent native populations, both here and abroad. Most recently, he has spent extensive time working with Native Alaskan tribal members, diagnosing and treating periodontal and oro-facial conditions. This was done with an eye towards reconstruction and improvement of not just oral health, but overall selfesteem.
